## NOTICE TO VISITORS WHO ARE NOT BENEFICIARIES OF THE JAMES BAY AND NORTHERN QUÉBEC AGREEMENT

### 2012 AUTHORIZED ACTIVITIES

REGISTRATION FORMS MUST BE COMPLETED PRIOR TO  
ENGAGING IN ANY ACTIVITY IN THE PARK  
(FORMS AVAILABLE AT [www.nunavikparks.ca](http://www.nunavikparks.ca))

	<b>Hiking and trekking</b>	On recommended trails. Access to maximum preservation zones prohibited.
	<b>Canoeing and kayaking</b>	Lakes and rivers in ambiance and service zones. Verify high- and low-water season conditions.
	<b>Camping</b>	At designated sites or where there is no vegetation. Access to maximum preservation zones prohibited. Prohibited on the crater ridge. Fees applicable. Pack out all waste.
	<b>Fishing</b>	<b>June 1 to September 7</b> (Refer to regulations for Area 23 North and for the park) Streams and lakes in the ambiance and service zones: • Park AND provincial licences required. • Plus landholding corporation licence required for category II lands. Prohibited in Lake Pingualuk. Catches must be consumed in the park. Only one catch may be packed out.
	<b>Ice fishing</b>	<b>April 1 to April 30, 2012, and December 1, 2012, to March 31, 2013</b> Special park education licence (SEG) required.
	<b>Skiing and snowshoeing</b>	On proposed trails. Access to maximum preservation zones prohibited.
	<b>Dogsledding</b>	On proposed trails. Access to maximum preservation zones prohibited. Dog teams must be tied up at least 60 meters from water bodies.
	<b>Swimming</b>	At your own risk. Prohibited in Lake Pingualuk.
	<b>Gathering</b>	In ambiance and service zones only. Edible plants for non-commercial purposes only.

- Any person who travels, stays or engages in an activity in the park must comply with the activities and conditions listed above. For all other activities, visitors must obtain the prior written authorization of the park director.
- Available activities depend on the weather and field conditions.

### MOTORIZED TRANSPORTATION TO ACCESS THE PARK MANDATORY AUTHORIZATION

<b>All aircraft</b>	Authorization required to land in the park. Landing prohibited in maximum preservation zones. Fly-overs of the park and the crater below 2,000 feet AGL prohibited.
<b>Snowmobile</b>	Authorization required to operate a snowmobile in the park. Snowmobile operation restricted to ambiance and service zones. Snowmobile operation prohibited in preservation and maximum preservation zones. Snowmobile operation permitted for travelling from one place to another. This use is not considered a recreational activity.
